NYLCVEF is grateful to the Westchester Community Foundation, which provided grant support for our electric vehicle public policy work in Westchester County.



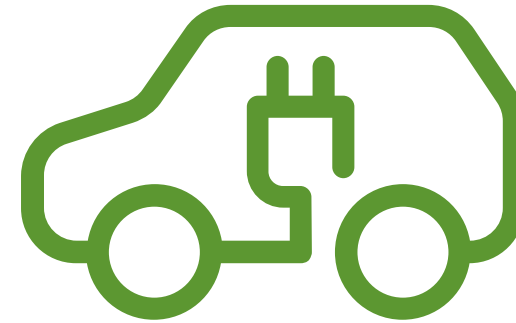
